



Packing for your South African safari

The most practical items to pack for your Safari are:

- Clothes in khaki, green, beige and neutral colors
- Light Long-sleeved shirts that offer protection from the sun
- T-shirts • Shorts or a light skirt
- Jeans or safari trousers for evenings and cooler days
- Jackets and sweaters for early morning and late afternoon hunting or around the campfire
- A lightweight waterproof jacket in case of rain (not common this time of here)
- Comfortable, already worn-out walking shoes
- Sunscreen, sunglasses, a hat, insect repellent, moisturizer and lip balm
- Camera equipment, extra batteries
- Shooting Sticks if you prefer your own
- USB flash drive or SD Card for copying your PH's pictures onto
- Head lamp • Pocket Knife/Multi tool
- Extra prescription glasses if required
- Prescription drugs if required
- Toiletries (Except Shampoo, Conditioner and Body Wash)
- Rifle soft case
- Passport
- Air Tickets
- Rifle Import Permit Application and relevant documentation if required

Useful Information to Remember

- All prepared meals, lunchboxes, snacks, bottled water, soda's, wine/beer, coffee and tea, will be provided in camp
- For Special requested drinks, town is 45 minutes away
- Wi-Fi is available in the Main Lodge area. Signal might not be what you are used to at home.
- Your Room equipped with a bath or shower, Shampoo, Conditioner, Towels and a Hairdryer • Laundry is done on a Daily Basis so please pack light
- If you plan to use your Bank card outside your Country, remember to give your bank notice about it. An additional charge of plus minus 2.5% for card transactions
- Do not bring Travelers Cheques, it's not accepted in South Africa
- Newer USD notes accepted in camp and most curio shops. Out of camp, South African Rands or Bank Cards accepted (not American Express)
- While traveling, any food, drinks, entry fees, shopping etc. will be for your own account
